IT'S A FAMILY AFFAIR

Mid-Prairie won the Class 2A distance medley relay for the third straight year and for the third straight year, a Hostetler anchored the victory. This time it was Danielle Hostetler, a freshman who outran another outstanding freshman, Panorama's Jaidyn Sellers, to give the Hawks their title. Mitzi Evans, who was third in the 400 on Thursday, gave Hostetler a comfortable lead with her 57.5-second 400 and it turned out to be just enough. Sellers closed fast and passed Hostetler briefly coming out of the final turn. But Hostetler, the 3000 champion on Thursday, pulled back ahead with 50 meters to go and Sellers couldn't answer. Mid-Prairie finished in 4:10.42 with Hostetler running her 800 leg in 2:18.9. Sellers closed in 2:14.3 to bring Panorama across the finish in 4:10.95.

Anna Hostetler anchored Mid-Prairie's victory in 2018 and Marie Hostetler did the same in 2019. With today's victory, the Hostetler sisters have combined for 14 state championships.

ANOTHER RELAY, ANOTHER WAHLERT WIN

Dubuque Wahlert Catholic just keeps racking up relay titles and the latest came in an event in which the Golden Eagles are especially dominant. With freshman Rylee Steffen on the anchor, Wahlert raced to a victory in the Class 3A 4x200 relay -- an event the school now has won four straight years, five of the last six years and nine of the last 14. It's the 26 relay title overall for Wahlert, more than any other school. No. 3 runner Meghan McDonald gave Steffen the lead and she held off Spencer's Allison Piercy to give her team the victory in 1:43.91. Spencer finished in 1:44.64.

BOCK BOLSTERS SOLON

Emma Bock anchored Solon to its second relay championship of the meet and her No. 1 rival made her work to get it. Bock held off fast-closing Ainsley Erzen to give Solon the victory in the Class 3A distance medley relay. That comes after Bock ran the final leg of the Lady Spartans' win in the 4x800 on Thursday. Bock was handed a 20-meter lead by 400 runner Kaia Holtkamp for her 800 carry. Erzen, meanwhile, was in eighth and last place when she got the baton. She made up ground quickly in passing six runners before the end of her first lap and kept closing on Bock. But Bock still enough left to hold her off. Solon was timed in 4:05.77 as Bock ran 2:14.2. Erzen sped to a 2:09.2 clocking in her carry to get Carlisle in the runner-up spot in 4:08.42. Bock and Erzen will tangle again in the 800 on Saturday.

MOUNT PLEASANT MASTERY

With Jadan Brumbaugh's victory, Mount Pleasant has produced two straight winners in the Class 3A shot put. Brumbaugh finished a consistent round by throwing 44-8 on her final attempt. Her worst throw of the morning was 42-2 2/3. Humboldt's Kendal Clark was second at 42-10 3/4. Lexi Magnani of Mount Pleasant won the 3A championship in 2019.

DARCI DOES IT FOR WINTERSET

Winterset now has a second state champion in a running event -- after a long wait. Darci Wiseman led from the start in winning the Class 3A 400 hurdles in 1:03.91. Her victory comes after a close second-place finish to Waukee star Mackenzie Carney at the Drake Relays. Winterset's only other state champion in a running event won her title in 1980, Kathy Jackson finishing first in the Class 2A 100.

DOUBLE DENIED

Carlisle's Isabelle Noring denied Keokuk's Miracle Ailes a double in the jumps. Noring edged out Ailes in the Class 3A long jump on a tiebreaker after both went 17-11 1/4. The title went to Noring because her second-best jump was 2 inches longer than Ailes' second-best mark. Ailes had a chance to win it on the final jump of the competition, but her hopes vanished when she fouled. Ailes won her second consecutive title in the long jump on Thursday.

RAISING THE BAR

Sheldon sophomore Maddie Olson treated the crowd to a show in the Class 2A high jump. Olson won the competition by clearing 5-9, which ties her for No. 15 on the state's all-time list and is the best jump at the state meet since Alexis Conaway of MOC-Floyd Valley cleared 5-9 in 2014. Olson missed three tries at 5-11 1/4, which would have been the 2A state meet record and put her No. 1 nationally. Before those misses at the end, Olson began the competition with nine straight clearances. Defending champion Kiersten Fisher of Southeast Valley was second at 5-5.
