Rain reappeared at 4:56 p.m during Class 4A 1600 with rain stopping at 5:40 before start of Class 4A 4x100 relay.

WAUKEE WINS IT ALL -- AGAIN

There's just no stopping Waukee in girls track and field. The Warriors ran off with the fifth consecutive Class 4A team championship and the eighth overall, finishing with 96 points. The eight titles are the most for any school in any class and the five in a row matches Davenport Assumption for the longest streak. Waukee got victories from Mackenzie Carney in the 100 hurdles and Layanna Green in the high jump and won the 4x200 and shuttle hurdle relays. Pleasant Valley was second with 57 points and Ames finished third with 52.

TIGERS TAKE HOME THE CROWN

Madrid's strength in the sprints was too much for the rest of the field in Class 1A. The Tigers compiled 51 points to win their first team championship, mainly on the strength of three relay victories. The foursome of Lilly Ostert, Ella Santi, Jillian Dodds and Erin Schieltz won the 4x100, 4x200 and sprint medley relays. Madrid also got a 1-3 finish from Santi and Dodds in the 100 and a 6-7 finish from Ostert and Schieltz in the 200. South O'Brien was second with 41 points and Tri-Cente third with 40.

PRAIRIE DOUBLES UP

Cedar Rapids Prairie came into the meet without a state championship in a relay. Now the Hawks have two. They won the distance medley for their first relay title on Friday and doubled their total with a victory today in the sprint medley, winning in 1:46.65. Sarah Jordan, Catie Reittinger and Gabby Cortez ran on both teams.

WAUKEE WINS AGAIN

Waukee continued its domination of the Class 4A shuttle hurdle relay and improved on its season best time. The Warriors won in 1:00.75, their fourth consecutive championship and eighth since 2009. It's one-hundredth of a second faster than their previous best this year keeps them at No. 2 on the state's all-time list. Waukee's 2017 foursome is the all-time leader at 1:00.61.

ONE FAST FAMILY

You want speed, check out the Santi family of Madrid. Sophomore Ella Santi became the third member of her family to win a state championship in the 100 when she claimed the Class 1A crown with a time of 12.74. Her sister Rylan won two titles in the 100 and their brother Michael also was a state champion in the event. Ella Santi, a sophomore, also ran on the winning 4x100, 4x200 and sprint medley relay teams.

DRAKE STADIUM IS PEYTON'S PLACE

The weather wasn't always the best, but it didn't matter to Tri-Center's Peyton Pogge. Pogge went 4-for-4 on the Blue Oval this weekend -- four races and four championships. She completed the distance triple with her victories in the Class 1A 800 and 1600 today. That was after she anchored Tri-Center to a victory in the distance medley relay and won the 3200. She was responsible for all 40 of Tri-Center's points in the team race, good enough for third place.

KEENEY IS KEEN AGAIN

Iowa City Liberty's Ashlyn Kenney continues to enjoy success on the Drake track, starting from the time she was a freshman. Keeney topped off her weekend victories in the Class 4A 800 and 1500 and earlier finished a close second in the 3000. She also won the 1500 as a freshman in 2019, won the 1500 at the Drake Relays last month and is a two-time Relays champion in the 3000.
